






CHARITABLE GIFTS OF GRAIN

Grain and livestock gifts donated directly to Beckman Catholic have several tax advantages. (Please seek the advice of a professional tax advisor.)

ENDOW IOWA **

Donations may be made to the Beckman accounts at the area Community Foundation. State of Iowa residents qualify for an additional 25% state income tax credit, in addition to federal deductibility. (Please seek the advice of a professional tax advisor.)

IN-KIND GIFTS **

In-kind gifts are non-cash donations that are used to carry out educational mission. Gifts in-kind include books, music, computers, construction materials and much more.

** Restricted gifts can not be credited to the Annual Appeal.



The Heritage Society was formed by the Beckman Endowment Corporation to help perpetuate secondary Catholic education in the Dyersville area. Gifts to the Heritage Society are endowed, with interest used to help supplement the annual operations at Beckman Catholic.

BEQUESTS

An outright bequest to Beckman Catholic High School may reduce the taxation on your estate, making the net cost of your gift much less than its face value. Also, donors may designate Beckman Catholic as a shared beneficiary on a life insurance policy. This can be done on a new or existing policy, an IRA annuity, employer group term insurance, or IRA / 401K retirement plan.

IRA

A distribution from your IRA after 59 ½ benefits the Endowment. A direct rollover to BCHS after 70 1/2 can offer a substantial tax advantage. RMD's.

LIFE INSURANCE

Transferring ownership of a Life Insurance policy to BCHS is a significant way to Leave a Legacy as well as create a charitable deduction upon transfer.

APPRECIATED SECURITIES

Gifts of marketable stocks, bonds, or mutual fund shares that have appreciated in value can have an immediate benefit for Beckman Catholic and a favorable tax result for contributors.

DEFERRED GIVING

Donors may choose to make charitable gifts during their lifetime. A charitable remainder trust (CRT) may be advantageous to some donors. Income from a CRT can be available to the donor for his/her life, and potentially to another beneficiary named by the donor. Upon the death of the donor and any named beneficiary, the remainder passes to the school. For more information on CRT's or other funding vehicles, please contact the Development office.

Faculty Perspective



Thousands of times I have walked through the gym doors at Beckman Catholic High School. I have entered to the sounds of student conversations, pep band tunes, dribbling balls, and clapping fans. Recently I caught a glimpse of the quote by Ralph Waldo Emerson posted on the

gym's southern wall. This quote is familiar to many, "Do not go where the path may lead, go instead where there is no path and leave a trail." These words reflect Beckman's Trailblazer history.

I am currently in my twenty-third year as a Trailblazer. Six of those years I walked the halls as a student. Seventeen years I have entered Beckman's doors as a science teacher, and eight of those years I have seen Catholic education through the eyes of my children. 
